



## Deanie Moseley Solether Reagan

Deanie Moseley Solether Reagan, 90, beloved daughter, sister, wife, mother, grandmother and friend to all, died peacefully in her home of seventy years in Weslaco, Texas on November 12th, 2024. By her side was her devoted son Mark, adoring husband of 42 years, Bob Reagan, and their steadfast friend and caregiver, Mary Ozias. Deanie was born on April 23rd, 1934, in Mosheim, Texas to William Ted and Anna Faye Calan Moseley, and was baptized in the Bosque River near Waco. During the course of her life, Deanie took great delight in the fact that she shared her birthdate with the one and only Shirley Temple, her childhood movie idol. Until the day she died, Deanie proudly carried an autographed photo of Shirley in her wallet, which read "To Deanie, Love Shirley." When Deanie was in second grade, she and her family moved to Pharr, Texas in the Rio Grande Valley. She went on to attend PSJA High School where she became a proud member of the school band, played the french horn and was a masterful baton twirler.

In 1951, while still in high school, Deanie met and fell in love with William Kent "Bill" Solether, after a chance meeting at Eddie's Covered Wagon. Deanie and Bill married shortly thereafter and welcomed three wonderful children; Bonnie, Jon and Mark, who were Deanie's pride and joy. There was nothing Deanie loved more than caring for her family. In her "leisure" time, Deanie's favorite pastimes included cooking, sewing, fishing in the nearby Arroyo and singing in the First United Methodist Church choir where the family were members. In 1971, Deanie and Bill opened Green Acres Miniature Golf Course in Weslaco.

Deanie's sharp mind for business and willingness to take risks served them well and Deanie fondly recalled the special friendships she made during that time and how monthly bridge games became a cherished interest. Deanie and Bill were married for 32 years. In 1982, Deanie began a new chapter in her life, as she met and subsequently married her soulmate and partner in life and adventure, Robert "Bob" Reagan. As luck would have it, both Deanie and Bob shared a love of travel, and they were able to revel in the sights and wonders of Paris, London, New York City and Atlantic City, a favorite destination in their latter years.

Remarkably, Bob just celebrated his one hundred and first birthday. Deanie was "One in a Million", and her unfettered joy, enthusiasm and zest for life were palpable. Her radiant smile lit up every room and was unforgettable. She devoted her life to serving others. She lived BIG and loved BIG and her love, kindness, wisdom, thoughtfulness, generosity and laughter will live in our hearts and memories forever.
