Ed entered heaven on March 28, 2024, he was 81 years old, of Mission, Texas. He was a devoted and loving husband, father and grandfather.

Ed was born on December 12, 1942 to Carl and Flora Montague in Morenci, Michigan. He went on to join the United States Air Force on January, 1961 and completed his 4 year service to his country on January, 1965. He returned to Fayette, Ohio and began working for Toledo Edison as a lineman. Shortly after working for Toledo Edison, Ed accepted the Lord as his Savior.

Ed was called to be a missionary and to begin his calling, he moved his family to Waukesha, Wisconsin, where he and his wife RaeAnn attended Bible school at New Tribes Missions, where they completed 4 years of Bible and Missionary training. Upon completion of his training, in 1980, Ed moved his family to Mission, Texas as his home, while beginning his mission work in Mexico, first in Campeche, Mexico and later moving his ministry to the Reynosa, Mexico area. While serving the Lord, Ed completed a Doctor of Divinity degree from Anchor Theological Seminary and Bible Institute on March, 2020.
