Pat was born in Streator, Illinois, on August 13, 1934, to Clarence and Ruth Marshall. She attended Eureka College in Illinois where she met her husband of forty-eight years, Norman Shupe. She was a member of Delta Zeta Sorority. One of her cherished moments was being selected as Eureka College Homecoming Queen and being escorted by actor and future President of the United States, Ronald Reagan.

They moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico where she began her career in education as a teacher in 1958. Later the family moved to the Rio Grande Valley, eventually making Edinburg their home. She continued working in education as a teacher and counselor, finally retiring after 42 years.
